Course Description: This course surveys the intricate details found in both Daniel and Revelation concerning eschatology.

Course Objectives:

From lectures, classroom discussion and independent study, the student will:

1. Have an overview of the background of the authors and their books of prophecy.
2. To explore the book of Daniel and Revelation and study the authorship, date and place of writings, audiences and major themes.
3. Gain an enhanced appreciation of prophecy, which will inspire one to future study for personal edification as well as for the effective teaching of God's Word.
4. Gain an understanding of the events that have already passed, and Events that have yet to take place.
5. Recognize and incorporate the significance and relevance of Eschatology for one's own life and worldview.

Classroom Procedures:

1. The student is expected to read the weekly assignments prior to coming to class. Class discussion will be on the material leading up to the class period.
2. Methods of instruction will be lecture, classroom discussion, videos, and power point.
3. Student interaction is greatly encouraged with classroom discussion. Questions are encouraged and respect given to those who are asking. If you have a question ASK IT.

4. There will be 2 tests given through the course of the semester. These will be given to see if each student understands course material. This is not pass/fail class, but for the respect of the students' effort of time given to the course, the most effective way of teaching must be reached.
5. Test will be take home and returned to the following class period for grading.
6. Attendance is expected for every class, as each class will build from the previous.
